Important Questions	Answers	Why This Matters:
<u>What is the overall deductible?</u>	For <u>network providers</u> \$300 individual/\$600 family; <u>out-of-network providers</u> \$10,000 individual/\$20,000 family	Generally, you must pay all of the costs from <u>providers</u> up to the <u>deductible</u> amount before this plan begins to pay. If you have other family members on the <u>plan</u> , each family member must meet their own individual <u>deductible</u> until the total amount of <u>deductible</u> expenses paid by all family members meets the overall family <u>deductible</u> .
<u>Are there services covered before you meet your deductible?</u>	Yes. Preventive care and prenatal care are covered before you meet your deductible.	This <u>plan</u> covers some items and services even if you haven't yet met the deductible amount, but a <u>copayment</u> or <u>coinsurance</u> may apply. For example, this <u>plan</u> covers certain <u>preventive services</u> without <u>cost sharing</u> and before you meet your <u>deductible</u> . <u>Are there other deductibles for specific services?</u>	No.	You don't have to meet <u>deductibles</u> for specific services.
<u>What is the out-of-pocket limit for this plan?</u>	For <u>network providers</u> \$5,000 individual/\$10,000 family; <u>out-of-network providers</u> \$30,000 individual/\$60,000 family	The <u>out-of-pocket</u> limit is the most you could pay in a year for covered services. If you have other family members in this plan, they have to meet their own <u>out-of-pocket limits</u> until the overall family <u>out-of-pocket</u> limit has been met.
<u>What is not included in the out-of-pocket limit?</u>	Employee premiums, balance-billed charges and healthcare this plan doesn't cover.	Even though you pay these expenses, they don't count toward the <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> .

Important Questions	Answers	Why This Matters:
Will you pay less if you use a <u>network provider</u> ?	Yes. See www.UFCWS.com or call 201-569-8801 EST or 209-952-6533 PST for a list of <u>network providers</u> .	This <u>plan</u> uses a <u>provider network</u> . You will pay less if you use a <u>provider</u> in the <u>plan's network</u> . You will pay the most if you use an <u>out-of-network provider</u> , and you might receive a bill from a <u>provider</u> for the difference between the <u>provider's</u> charge and what your <u>plan</u> pays (balance billing). Be aware, your <u>network provider</u> might use an <u>out-of-network provider</u> for some services (such as lab work). Check with your <u>provider</u> before you get services.
Do you need a <u>referral</u> to see a <u>specialist</u> ?	No.	You can see the <u>specialist</u> you choose without a <u>referral</u> .

Does this plan provide Minimum Essential Coverage? Yes

Minimum Essential Coverage generally includes plans, health insurance available through the Marketplace or other individual market policies, Medicare, Medicaid, CHIP, TRICARE, and certain other coverage. If you are eligible for certain types of Minimum Essential Coverage, you may not be eligible for the premium tax credit.

Does this plan meet the Minimum Value Standards? Yes

If your plan doesn't meet the Minimum Value Standards, you may be eligible for a premium tax credit to help you pay for a plan through the Marketplace.
